Special Project: Garlic Mustard Pull - Kilby McCann

Kilby McCann provided an update on the recent "Pull" day, noting that despite the rainy conditions, six bags of garlic mustard were removed in two hours. During the session, Japanese Knotweed was also identified. Daniel Brumar will be reaching out to the town to inform them of the findings. Additionally, there may be another "Pull" event scheduled for a Saturday morning in June (either June 7th or June 14th). Sign-up sheets are available at the back for those interested in participating.

Show and Tell: Winter Sowing - Beth Hunter

Beth Hunter presented the results of her first foray into Winter Sowing wildflower seeds. She started the process by planting seeds December 21, 2024. The seeds were placed in 24 separate pots then put into an opaque plastic lidded bin that Beth altered for the purpose.









The bin was left outdoors, with no additional watering required. By April 1st of this year, the seeds had developed a moss-like covering as most of the seeds germinated. Only four of the 24 pots failed to germinate.

Beth generously brought the plants to the June 4th meeting to share with members. The resulting healthy plants are still small early seedlings, but will soon be ready to go into gardens.. Members and guests were encouraged to take home one or two each.

Mary Shearman Reid, Owner of Green Thumb Garden Centre in Ottawa.

Mary spoke on *Vines and their Care.* She showed us how vines are versatile, while adding a different dimension to your garden. Some are aggressive – some are slow to take hold.



Mary shared her deep knowledge of vines and their history as well as discussed varieties that are popular today. Mary talked about Trumpet Vines, Multi Blue Clematis, Jackamani, Hyacinth Beans, English Ivy, Climbing Roses, Honeysuckle, Wild Grapes to name a few. A very interesting topic delivered in a conversational manner, with detail and humour.

The audience were treated to generous answers to their questions on many aspects of vines and their care. One question posed by Linda Bartlett about her non-flowering kiwi triggered a bit of further research. Mary followed up the next day with the following:

Linda – I did some quick searches last night and this am re your non-fruiting kiwi. Could be too much nitrogen and not enough of the other nutrients. More likely, after our conversation – a pruning situation. There are a lot of good university sites that suggest the A. kolomikta bears its fruits on last year's growth. Happy gardening
