### **Opening Remarks**

President Rick Roberts called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., He opened with a Land Acknowledgement then welcomed attendees and shared a brief agenda of the meeting.

#### **Director and Committee announcements**

- Rob Drapeau Annual Photography Competition: Rob announced that panels of photography entries were on display with winners identified. He thanked Doreen Harris for her guidance as Rob takes on this new role. Formal presentations to the winners will be awarded at the December AGM on Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>. Rob is planning to launch a new contest for 2026, and hopes members will continue to take lots of photos and submit them for the competition next year.
- Irene Tobis Victoria School Museum Garden Coordinator Report: Irene thanked Paul Pietsch for his hard work all through this past summer, creating a wonderful new rock garden at Victoria School Garden. Paul donated many plants from his extensive personal collection that thrive in the rock gardens at his home. Paul also contributed miniature early spring bulbs whose blooms we look forward to enjoying each Spring. Thank you Paul! Irene also reported that we had a total of 594 volunteer hours donated at the VSG during 2025. The volunteer work at VSG is finished for this year.
- Barbara Fowler Flower Show Committee Report Barbara Fowler reported there were 26 participants in the Fall Flower and Edibles Show. 'Heart-warming for us', Barbara spoke to the high quality of the exhibits and thanked all for participating.
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• Margaret Coombs – Hospitality Committee: Jams, Jellies & Preserves Competition Margaret highlighted the environmental impact of purchasing out-of-season produce, including carbon footprint and reliance on migrant labor. Participants are encouraged to share recipes and tips after the event to promote food preservation practices. Margret informed that judging of the contest would be done during the meeting and that winners would be announced before the refreshment break. Margaret thanked all who assisted in making this event a success (Cindy & Tim, Hannah, Nicole Roper, Donna Lahey, Cindy McBride, Amanda Woham, Anita Ruus, Laura Cupper, Valencia Logan and Kilby McCann). Hearty applause followed the announcement that entries would be available to try during the break.

## **Guest Speaker**

Our guest speaker was Marcin Padlewski N D. who practiced as a registered doctor of Naturopathic Medicine with the College of Naturopaths of Ontario, follows a holistic approach towards wellbeing. He shared practical medicinal information about plants that grow in our local communities.



Preferring a hands-on casual style to meetings, Marcin encouraged attendees to rearrange their chairs around the presentation table and exhibits so there would be closer interaction during the presentation. Based on much member participation, it was a popular choice



The focus of the discussion was on community engagement through discussions on food preservation, local sourcing, and the benefits of medicinal plants. Highlights included a presentation by Marcin on local medicinal plants, particularly stinging nettle and plantain, white pine and balsam fir, emphasizing their health benefits and culinary uses. Participants engaged in discussions about the quality of home-grown plants versus store-bought options, the properties of chaga fungus, and various herbal treatments.

Live plants and books were available for viewing by the members. A handout was provided to the members as an overview of the selected plants and their therapeutic applications (not to be used as medical advice). References were made to several books including: *Naturopathic Botanical Medicine*, *The Healing Trees*, *Medicinal Plants of Canada*, *Health Through God's Pharmacy*, *Medical Herbalism* and *The Fungal Pharmacy* 



Paul Pietsch formally thanked Marcin for his presentation and generous response to questions while presenting a thank you card and honorarium.
