GUEST SPEAKER: Brittny Lepage, the Dahlia Darling

Brittany is an exceptional grower, hybridizer and seller of dahlias who lives and works right here in Carleton Place. Her deep knowledge and infectious energy was much appreciated by everyone.



Brittany shared advice and strategies in selecting, growing and caring for all forms of Dahlia's. Her presentation was supported by wonderfully illustrated Powerpoint slides which she used for hybridizing. Discussion included winter storage, pest control, and more.

Two lessons that stood out for me are that a dahlia leaf cutting can grow to a full plant that produces both blooms and multiple tubers in the first season. Going to try that. The second is tubers... turns out I could have had a lot more dahlias. This fall I'll split our clumps into single tubers for storage. Everyone learned something new.



It was especially interesting to see examples of some of the named varieties that Brittany has developed in her Carleton Place garden. It's no surprise that the names of the Dahlia Darling
