Opening Remarks

President Rick Roberts called the meeting to order. Kilby McCann acknowledged the Algonquin Ani-shin-aabe Nation.



Treasurer's Report

Linda Bartlett presented the financial report, showing a balance of \$8,066.00. The society has received the \$1,000 cheque from OMAFRA. Additionally, Linda prepared and distributed printed copies of this month's newsletter.

Banner Presentation

Linda Bartlett and Irene Tobis introduced the new banner and explained why the old one had to be replaced. The old banner, which had been found after two years at the Carleton Place Library, was used during the last Summer Flower Show.



The new banner will be 6 feet high by 2 feet wide and made of vinyl. Two banners will be created at a cost of \$40.00 each.

Questions were raised regarding the abundance of information and the absence of "D2" in the verbiage. Linda explained that similar banners from other societies follow this format.

Motion

Rob Drapeau moved to approve the new emblem (Native Blue Flag Iris) and the redesign of the CPDHS banner. This was seconded by Anita Ruus. The motion passed with 55 in favor, 0 against, and 2 abstentions.

Book Club Update

Member Margaret Coombs shared that the Winter Book Club is reading Braiding Sweetgrass, a book about an Indigenous woman's relationship with botany and the native way of life.

Paul Pietsch announced that he would be visiting [Moore Water Gardens](#), where they sell bare-root plants like water lilies and sacred lotuses. He will also be going to [Nursery Canadale](#), which specializes in Japanese maples (less hardy varieties). Anne Harbord brought in two Cana Lilies (Cleopatra) with green shoots that were potted in December.



Director's Update – Bri Logan




Daniel reminded everyone of the [Orchid Show at Algonquin College on April 26-27, 2025](#).
