They were engaged and a steady stream of children and youth from before 11am to after 3pm. They loved the members' donations, including mugs, tea pots, jade plants, chamomile and fun seeds like candy cane zinnias. **Janet, Beth, Valencia, Abhann and Ryan were amazing volunteers.** Some familiar families from last year and the RONA workshops told us stories about the plants that grew last year from the seeds we planted together and the pasta garden seedlings that are going strong from March. Many were using the seeds and plants to start their gardens this year, and some children hoped to see butterflies on the dill seedlings we gave away. "*
